MR S MINNIKIN ASKED MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND MAIN ROADS (HON M BAILEY)—

### QUESTION:

Will the Minister advise the number of allegations of corrupt conduct, or breaches of the Code of Conduct for the Queensland Public Service involving a government employee, from 2019–20 to 2021–22 for each of the following entities (reported separately by financial year and agency) (a) Department of Transport and Main Roads, (b) RoadTek, (c) Queensland Rail, (d) Gold Coast Waterway Authority and (e) Cross River Rail Delivery Authority?

### ANSWER:

I thank the Member for Chatsworth for the question.

The Crime and Corruption Commission publishes data about allegations of corrupt conduct made against Queensland Government agencies, including the Department of Transport and Main Roads (including RoadTek) and the Gold Coast Waterways Authority online at www.ccc.qld.gov.au/corruption/corruption-allegations-data-dashboard.

The Department of the Transport and Main Roads reports on conduct and performance matters that are categorised as Category 2, 3(a) and 3(b) of the Conduct and Performance Excellence (CaPE) case categorisation framework to the Public Service Commission, which publishes this data for Queensland Government agencies annually. Queensland Rail and the Cross River Rail Delivery Authority employees are engaged under the Fair Work Act 2009 and are not subject to the CaPE categorisation framework.
