**MR M BOOTHMAN** ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND CORRECTIVE SERVICES AND MINISTER FOR FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES (HON M RYAN)—

QUESTION:

Will the Minister advise how many Police officers have been allocated to Road Policing Command since 2015 across the Gold Coast (reported separately in table format by division, calendar year and FTE hours worked)?

ANSWER:

I am advised by the Queensland Police Service (QPS) that during the 2020-21 financial year, the Road Policing Command was disestablished and replaced by the Road Policing and Regional Support Command. This restructure transitioned Road Policing Units from the Road Policing Command, as central functions, to police Districts. Accordingly, the best measure for comparison is a district comparison.

The approved police officer strength allocated to Road Policing Command per calendar year for the Gold Coast Police District since 2015 is detailed in the table below. Please note that the data for the 2022 calendar year will be available at the end of the calendar year.

The QPS has advised that a manual examination of each position would be required to calculate FTE hours worked. This is considered an unjustifiable use of police resources at this time.
