DR C ROWAN ASKED MINISTER FOR EDUCATION, MINISTER FOR INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS AND MINISTER FOR RACING (HON G GRACE)

QUESTION:

With reference to the teacher workforce—

Will the Minister advise (a) how many teachers have resigned over the last three years (reported separately by primary and secondary school and by region), (b) what positions were held by those teachers who have resigned in secondary schools (e.g. English, Science, Maths) and (c) how many teacher aides have resigned over the last three years (reported separately by region)?

ANSWER:

At the outset, it's important to note that the data requested covers an atypical period of time when Queensland schools were working through the COVID world health pandemic.

a) how many teachers have resigned over the last three years (reported separately by primary and secondary school and by region)

For the calendar years 2020, 2021 and 2022, the number of permanent teachers (headcount) who resigned is as follows:

Of the 1207 resignations in 2022, 128 (or 10%) had been suspended through vaccination suspension prior to their resignation and it could therefore be reasonably inferred that vaccination was a major reason for these resignations.

It is important to note these figures only include employee-initiated resignations and do not include retirement or other forms of separation, which make up broader attrition figures published in the Department of Education's Annual Report. Retention rates for Queensland state school teachers have remained stable since 2015, at around 96%.

b) what positions were held by those teachers who have resigned in secondary schools (e.g. English, Science, Maths)

The department does not retain information about the subject specialties each teacher was teaching at the time of their resignation.

c) how many teacher aides have resigned over the last three years (reported separately by region)?

For the calendar years 2020, 2021 and 2022, the number of permanent teacher aides (headcount) who resigned is as follows:
