DR M ROBINSON asked the Deputy Premier, Minister for State Development, Infrastructure, Local Government and Planning and Minister Assisting the Premier on Olympics Infrastructure (HON S MILES) –

QUESTION:

With reference to the Dunwich ferry terminal upgrade which was committed to by all levels of government in the SEQ City Deal—

Will the Deputy Premier advise (a) if the federal funding is confirmed in the 2022 budget, (b) the amount being contributed by each level of government (reported separately) and (c) the timeline for completion of the project?

ANSWER:

- a) The Australian Government has committed to honour all previously signed City Deal commitments. In the 2022-2023 Federal Budget, the Australian Government confirmed funding of \$363.9 million over four years, more than half of the total Australian Government SEQ City Deal funding commitment. This is the same amount of funding provided in the March 2022 Federal Budget.
- b) The SEQ City Deal funding commitments announced in early 2022 were not broken down by individual project. The SEQ City Deal is supported by a \$667.77 million investment from the Australian Government, \$618.78 million from the Queensland Government and \$501.62 million from the Council of Mayors (SEQ).
- c) The SEQ City Deal implementation planning has commenced. The three levels of government have been working together to finalise an Implementation Plan for public release by the end of 2022. The Dunwich Ferry Terminal Upgrade has also been identified as a key project in the Gumpi Master Plan, which is set for release in 2023.
