MR S MINNIKIN ASKED MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND MAIN ROADS (HON M BAILEY)—

QUESTION:

Will the Minister provide a list of all maritime incidents reported to Maritime Safety Queensland (MSQ) at the Port of Brisbane for February to September 2022 including (a) the date and time of the incident, (b) the entity making the report, (c) details of the incident and (d) the date that the incident was reported to MSQ?

ANSWER:

I thank the Member for Chatsworth for the question.

As previously advised in my response to Question on Notice 64, tabled on 25 March 2022, Maritime Safety Queensland (MSQ) continues to work with all port service providers and the wider Port of Brisbane community to build a positive reporting culture with the aim of improving marine safety.

The process relies on a culture of transparency across all key maritime participants including tugs, terminals, pilots, the Port of Brisbane, Vessel Traffic services and the ships' masters that visit the port.

In the period 1 February 2022 to 30 September 2022, a total of four marine incident reports have been received by MSQ. A table containing details of the marine incident reports follows.
