MR S O'CONNOR ASKED THE MINISTER FOR THE ENVIRONMENT AND THE GREAT BARRIER REEF AND MINISTER FOR SCIENCE AND YOUTH AFFAIRS (HON M SCANLON)—

QUESTION:

Will the Minister (a) explain the variance in 'Improving Great Barrier Reef Water Quality' expenses between 2022 (\$5,019,000) and 2021 (\$14,555,000) as detailed on page 71 of the department's Annual Report 2021-22 under B2-3 Grants and Subsidies, (b) detail what changes were made in delivery models and (c) detail changes to the profile of payments that led to this decrease?

ANSWER:

I thank the Member for the question.

The Palaszczuk Government has committed close to \$1 billion towards protecting Queensland's iconic Great Barrier Reef since 2015. This record level of investment includes \$270.1 million over five years to 2025-26 to continue the Queensland Reef Water Quality Program which includes \$20 million to expand the Reef Assist program to all six Reef catchment areas to improve catchment health and create regional jobs.

- (a) The variance is predominantly due to the completion of projects including a number of projects under the initial Reef Assist Program as part of the Government's response to the COVID-19 pandemic as well as some other minor Reef Water Quality projects.
- (b) There was no change in the delivery model for these programs which are delivered under contractual agreements with delivery partners.
- (c) Details in the following table:
