MR A POWELL ASKED THE MINISTER FOR HEALTH AND AMBULANCE SERVICES (HON Y D'ATH)—

QUESTION

With reference to patients waiting for Cochlear Implants through Queensland Health—

Will the Minister advise (a) the number of patients on the waiting list for Cochlear Implants as of 1 January for each calendar year from 2015 to 2022, (b) the number of Cochlear Implant procedures undertaken each calendar year from 2015 to 2022 and (c) the number of patients currently on the waiting list for Cochlear Implants?

ANSWER

I have been advised by the department that the following table represents the waiting list for Cochlear Implants for each calendar year through Queensland Health. It is noted that no data is available as at 1 January 2015 as the Elective Surgery Data Collection (ESDC) only started on 1 July 2015.
