**MS A LEAHY** ASKED THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL AND MINISTER FOR JUSTICE, MINISTER FOR WOMEN AND MINISTER FOR THE PREVENTION OF DOMESTIC AND FAMILY VIOLENCE (HON S FENTIMAN) –

**QUESTION:**

Will the Attorney-General advise if the government will include the mandatory disclosure of flood and other natural hazard risk in the proposal to implement a statutory seller disclosure scheme in Queensland?

**ANSWER:**

I thank the Member for the question.

The Palaszczuk Government is committed to modernising Queensland's property laws, following the extensive work of the Commercial and Property Law Research Centre at the Queensland University of Technology (QUT).

Government recently consulted on an exposure draft of the new Property Law Bill, and as part of that process, the public and interested stakeholders were invited to comment on whether flood information should be included in the scheme and, if so, the form that the disclosure might take. The results of consultation are currently under consideration.
