MR T NICHOLLS asked the Minister for Children and Youth Justice and Minister for Multicultural Affairs (HON L LINARD)—

QUESTION

With reference to youth justice and youth offenders in Mackay and Rockhampton—

Will the Minister advise from 2017 to 2022 (reported separately by quarter for Mackay and Rockhampton) (a) the total number of unique youth offenders and (b) how many youth offenders reoffended whilst on bail?

ANSWER

The Palaszczuk Government is committed to reducing offending and reoffending and keeping the community safe.

Across Queensland, the number of young people who offend has decreased. The number of young people with a proven offence decreased 13 per cent in 2021-22 compared to 2020-21, and 28 per cent compared to 2018-19.

This demonstrates the programs, services and interventions designed to intervene early, identify the underlying causes of offending and address those issues, are having an impact.

Across the Mackay and Rockhampton Local Government Areas (LGAs), the number of distinct young people with a proven offence has decreased by 11 per cent since 2020-21 and 21 per cent since 2018-19.

As the Member has requested the total number of unique youth offenders by quarter, it should be noted a young person can be counted only once per quarter but can be counted in multiple quarters. Because young people can be counted in more than one quarter, figures for individual quarters cannot be summed to determine distinct young people over longer periods.

(a) Table A provides the total number of young people who have committed offences within the Mackay and Rockhampton LGAs, from July 2017 to June 2022.
