MS R BATES ASKED THE MINISTER FOR HEALTH AND AMBULANCE SERVICES (HON Y D'ATH)—

QUESTION

Will the Minister detail the following information in relation to any contract entered into with Deloitte since 1 July 2021 by any Queensland Health entity (a) a description of work/project associated with the contract, (b) dollar value of the contract and (c) the start and end date of each contract?

ANSWER

I am advised that since 1 July 2021 the Department of Health has the following contracts with Deloitte.
