MR T NICHOLLS ASKED THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL AND MINISTER FOR JUSTICE, MINISTER FOR WOMEN AND MINISTER FOR THE PREVENTION OF DOMESTIC AND FAMILY VIOLENCE (HON S FENTIMAN) –

QUESTION:

Will the Attorney-General provide the total number of judges and magistrates in Queensland (reported separately by year for the last five years)?

ANSWER:

The total number of judges and magistrates appointed in Queensland varies over the course of a year as resignations and retirements take effect and new appointments are made.

The number of judges and magistrates in Queensland as at 30 June for each of the previous four years and the current year to date are outlined in the table below.
