MS A CAMM ASKED MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND MAIN ROADS (HON M BAILEY)—

QUESTION:

Will the Minister advise the capital investment in boat ramp infrastructure (reported separately per boat ramp) across Mackay and Whitsunday local government (LGA) since 2015?

ANSWER:

I thank the Member for Whitsunday for the question.

The Department of Transport and Main Roads, through Maritime Safety Queensland, has delivered a total of \$27,991,000 boating infrastructure projects since January 2015. The projects are listed in the following table.
