Under the panel's terms of reference, the panel must deliver its report to the Minister within 12 months of being appointed. As indicated in the panel's published workplan, this report is expected to be provided in October 2022.

Under the panel's published stakeholder engagement plan, a discussion paper will be released online for four weeks public consultation. This will provide all interested parties the opportunity to provide input to the review.
