MS A LEAHY asked the Deputy Premier and Minister for State Development, Infrastructure, Local Government and Planning and Minister Assisting the Premier on Olympics Infrastructure (HON S MILES) –

QUESTION:

With reference to the Resilient Homes Fund –

Will the Deputy Premier advise of the eligibility criteria for the following Resilient household rebuild program, Home raising program, Voluntary home buy-back program (reported separately)?

ANSWER:

The Queensland and Australian governments have introduced a \$741 million Resilient Homes Fund to assist eligible homeowners repair, retrofit, or raise flood-affected homes, and in some cases to buy-back homes.

To be eligible for funding to repair, retrofit or raise a home, the following criteria must be met:

- the home is within one of the local government areas activated for Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements
- the applicant is the owner-occupier or landlord of the property who is applying for funding
- the home is a residence (house/unit/duplex).
- the home was affected during the 2021–22 flooding events listed below:
 - Central, southern, and western Queensland rainfall and flooding 10 November to 3 December 2021
 - Ex-tropical cyclone Seth 29 December 2021 to 10 January 2022
 - South-east Queensland rainfall and flooding 22 February to 5 April 2022
 - Southern Queensland Flooding 6 to 20 May 2022.
- the home was inundated by water in liveable rooms or areas.

Following an assessment, eligible resilience options will be identified for the home.

Where voluntary buy-back is identified as an option, homeowners will be contacted by the Queensland Reconstruction Authority regarding the next steps.
