MR S ANDREW asked the Minister for Health and Minister for Ambulance Services (HON Y D'ATH)—

QUESTION

Will the Minister advise how many deaths in emergency departments there have been for the period from 2018 to 2022 (reported separately by year and triage category)?

ANSWER:

The number of deaths in the emergency departments across Queensland has been between 804 to 900 over the past four financial years, with the data for June 2022 not yet available. The largest contributor being cardiac arrest, accounting for approximately 30 per cent of the deaths recorded.

A primary diagnosis of 'Cardiac Arrest – Unspecified' accounting for approximately 30% of the deaths recorded.

In the 2020/21 financial year there was over 1.8 million presentations to emergency departments across Queensland. The proportion of patients who died in the emergency department in Queensland was 0.041 per cent, compared to 0.055 per cent nationally.
