**MR J LANGBROEK** ASKED THE MINISTER FOR COMMUNITIES AND HOUSING, MINISTER FOR DIGITAL ECONOMY AND MINISTER FOR THE ARTS (HON L ENOCH)—

QUESTION:

With reference to the 15 Care Army volunteers to Neighbourhood Centres—

Will the Minister advise (a) how many of Queensland's 127 neighbourhood centres have the 15 worked with (reported separately by centre) and (b) what is the allocation process?

ANSWER:

In April 2020 the Care Army was launched. Almost 28,000 Queenslanders answered the call to volunteer to help vulnerable people in the community to respond to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

As of 31 August 2022, there are 46,506 potential volunteers registered on the Care Army database. The Care Army database is referred to by many Volunteer Involving Organisations for the identification of volunteers.

The 15 Care Army volunteers referenced in the question are unable to be identified.
