MR S MINNIKIN ASKED MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND MAIN ROADS (HON M BAILEY)—

QUESTION:

With reference to comments by the Director General at Estimates regarding the European Train Control System project, listed in QTRIP with a value of \$717m, that the total project budget is \$764m with the difference made up of funding previously held by Queensland Rail and the Cross River Rail Delivery Authority—

Will the Minister list all other projects in the current QTRIP that are being partly funded by another entity, together with the entity's name and the amount of the funding they hold?

ANSWER:

I thank the Member for Chatsworth for the question.

The Palaszczuk Government is delivering its seventh record transport and roads infrastructure program in a row, as detailed in the *Queensland Transport and Roads Investment Program* 2022–23 to 2025–26, which outlines \$29.7 billion in investment over the next four years and is estimated to support an average of 25,200 direct jobs over the life of the program.

Projects that are published in the QTRIP include a breakdown of funding contributions into Queensland Government contributions, Australian Government contributions and local government/other contributions.

QTRIP also includes Queensland and Australian government contributions to local government-led projects, which are usually in the form of a grant.

Excluding smaller value works of maintenance and planning, projects listed in the current QTRIP that have:

- Queensland Government contributions from Queensland Rail and the Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) are:
 - \$96.9 million Burdekin River Bridge, rehabilitation program Queensland Rail's contribution is \$23.4 million
 - \$95 million Loganlea train station relocation Queensland Rail's contribution is
 \$23.4 million
- contributions from a developer and TMR are:
 - \$1.85 million Southport Nerang Road and Stewart Parade, improve intersection developer contribution is \$620,500
 - \$4.4 million D'Aguilar Highway (Caboolture Kilcoy), Pumicestone Road and Dances Road intersection, improve safety – developer contribution is \$73,000.
