MR L POWER ASKED MINISTER FOR EDUCATION, MINISTER FOR INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS AND MINISTER FOR RACING (HON G GRACE)

## QUESTION:

Will the Minister advise the total infrastructure investment in the Logan Electorate State Schools since 2015 and the total infrastructure investment between 2012 and 2015 (reported separately by each state school)?

## ANSWER:

The Department of Education is committed to building and maintaining fit-for-purpose learning environments that support educational outcomes.

Since 2015, the department has invested \$351.1 million (including GST) in building and maintaining education infrastructure at state schools in the Logan Electorate, including a planned investment of \$35.4 million (including GST) in 2023–24.

The department will also be delivering a new primary school with FamilyLinQ and a new secondary school in Park Ridge.

Between 2012 and 2015, the department invested \$5.3 million (including GST) in building and maintaining education infrastructure at state schools in the Logan Electorate.
