MR R KATTER asked the Deputy Premier, Minister for State Development, Infrastructure, Local Government and Planning and Minister Assisting the Premier on Olympic and Paralympic Games Infrastructure (HON S MILES) –

QUESTION:

Will the Deputy Premier outline based on 2023 estimates how much public money in total (not limited to the \$7b State and Federal co-fund) the Queensland Government expects will be spent on the infrastructure needed to host the 2032 Brisbane Olympic Games?

ANSWER:

Under the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games Intergovernmental Agreement, infrastructure that will support Brisbane 2032 will be funded by the Australian and Queensland governments. The Australian Government is funding the new \$2.5 billion Brisbane Arena and the Queensland Government is funding the \$2.7 billion upgrade to The Gabba. \$1.87 billion has been allocated to sixteen new and upgraded venues.

The cost for each venue, and specific project inclusions, will be determined through the Project Validation Report process, which includes a reference design for each venue. For some venues, local councils may be contributing additional funding for additional aspects above the infrastructure requirements under the Brisbane 2032 Master Plan.
