MS R BATES ASKED MINISTER FOR HEALTH, MENTAL HEALTH AND AMBULANCE SERVICES AND MINISTER FOR WOMEN (HON S FENTIMAN)—

QUESTION

With reference to answer to Question on Notice No. 1204 of 2021—

Will the Minister provide, for each of the 106 reporting hospitals listed on the 'Hospital Performance' website, the total number of beds (a) available in September 2023 and (b) unavailable in September 2023?

ANSWER

The Palaszczuk Government has a proud record of delivering the health services and infrastructure that our growing state needs.

Since 2015, we have opened more than 1,350 new beds across the state, and will be delivering around 500 more this year. In addition, we are hiring the skilled clinicians needed to look after patients in these beds, with approximately 19,000 extra frontline staff hired since 2015.

Beds can be temporarily unavailable due to a number of factors, such as patient demand, resourcing, hospital renovations and refurbishments, and transferal of services.

I am advised that the below table lists the number of available bed and temporarily unavailable beds, as at 27 September 2023 for each hospital listed on the 'Hospital Performance – Reporting Hospitals' website.

- 1. Available beds are those available on the last Wednesday of the reference month and are exclusively or predominately used for admitted patients with nursing and auxiliary staff available to service patients who might occupy them.
- 2. Data are consistent with previous counting rules for reporting of available/total beds and are based on current submitted data as of 24 October 2023 which are not published elsewhere.
- 3. 'Temporarily unavailable beds' are beds that (as of the last Wednesday of the month) are NOT immediately available, and there is a planned date for making the beds available.
- 4. Data are for the September 2023 period and are preliminary, subject to change.
- 5. Variations in numbers can relate to changes in the predominant use of the bed such as a change in the model of care employed in an emergency department.
