MR J KRAUSE ASKED TREASURER AND MINISTER FOR TRADE AND INVESTMENT (HON C DICK)—

QUESTION:

With reference to Camera Detected Offence Program traffic infringement notices issued during the 2022-23 financial year—

Will the Treasurer advise (a) the total number, (b) the number paid before the fine due date and (c) the number that remain unpaid as of this date and the total value of these fines?

ANSWER:

I am advised that, from 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2023, there were 988,086 infringement notices issued for camera detected red light and speeding offences, which remain issued.

On 30 November 2022, responsibility for issuing Camera Detected Offence Program infringement notices for mobile phone and seatbelt offences transitioned to the Queensland Revenue Office.

From 1 December 2022 to 30 June 2023, there were 67,333 infringement notices issued for camera detected mobile phone and seatbelt offences that remain issued.

In relation to the above, 750,483 were finalised within the 28 day timeframe to finalise an infringement notice.

As of 19 October 2023, 159,074 infringement notices remain unpaid totalling \$91,335,845.21.
