MR M BERKMAN ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND CORRECTIVE SERVICES AND MINISTER FOR FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES (HON M RYAN)—

QUESTION:

With reference to the Western Australian Government's initiative to equip police officers with the opioid overdose reversal drug naloxone and the year-long trial which saw 20 lives potentially saved in that jurisdiction— Will the Minister commit to including naloxone in Queensland Police Service tool kits and ensure police are trained on how to administer the life-saving medicine?

ANSWER:

I am advised by the Queensland Police Service (QPS) that the inclusion of naloxone as a first aid product and any required training for police and relevant staff members is currently being explored.
