QUESTION:

With reference to a constituent being advised that building companies in Brisbane had been offered private tenders to quote on sustainable housing to go on some reclaimed land the Palaszczuk Government had obtained on the Gold Coast and the constituent is concerned the state is looking at the Eco-Parkland—

Will the Deputy Premier advise whether the State Government has any plans to put housing on the Currumbin Eco-Parkland?

ANSWER:

The Queensland Government has no plans to put housing on the Currumbin Eco-Parkland.

In 2020, the Palaszczuk Government listened to community groups such as Friends of Currumbin who put forward a strong case for the protection of this extraordinary piece of land at the beginning of the biodiverse Currumbin Valley.

Economic Development Queensland will continue its efforts to transform the site to enable future community use and preserve and improve upon its strong ecological values.
