MR M CRANDON ASKED MINISTER FOR HEALTH, MENTAL HEALTH AND AMBULANCE SERVICES AND MINISTER FOR WOMEN (HON S FENTIMAN)—

QUESTION

With reference to the 'Health Funding Uplift' measure described on page 137 of 2023-24 Budget Paper 4—

Will the Minister outline (a) a description of each of the programs funded in 2022-23 through the uplift, (b) the value of funding for each of the programs described above in 2022-23, (c) a description of each of the programs funded in 2023-24 through the uplift, (d) the value of funding for each of the programs described above in 2023-24 and (e) the value of any uncommitted monies from 2023-24 to 2026-27 financial years (reported separately by financial year)?

ANSWER

The below table provides descriptions of the programs funded through the Health Funding Uplift over the period 2022-23 to 2026-27 and the funding allocations.

Not all these programs are funded exclusively through the Health Funding Uplift. In some cases, there are also contributions from other sources, such as operational growth funding provided in the 2022-23 budget and prior year budget surpluses. Funding can also be reallocated between years based on expenditure requirements.

In addition, the 2023-24 Queensland Health budget includes a range of programs to address demand and cost pressures and support a suite of programs and initiatives targeting improving ambulance responsiveness and reducing ramping, addressing pressures on emergency departments, reducing wait times for surgery and specialist clinics, as well as boosting women's health care and mental health care. For instance:

- The Government has committed \$764 million to reducing ambulance ramping and improving access to emergency departments.
- Around \$224 million is being invested in addressing surgery and specialist clinic backlogs including continuing the planned care recovery initiative created during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- A \$34.8 million investment in women's healthcare includes continuing the Growing Deadly Families Strategy, the development of a 10-year Queensland Women's and Girls' Health Strategy and expanding outreach obstetrics and gynaecology services.
- Mental health services will receive a \$301.4 million boost, which will assist in implementing the \$1.645 billion Better Care Together: a plan for Queensland's state-funded mental health alcohol and other drug services to 2027.
