MR P WEIR ASKED TREASURER AND MINISTER FOR TRADE AND INVESTMENT (HON C DICK)—

QUESTION:

Will the Treasurer advise the process for disability or aged pensioner householders to claim the cost-of-living electricity rebate if living in a shared residence with a person who is not on a pension however both names appear on the electricity account?

ANSWER:

Queenslanders are paying less for electricity in 2023-24 through the Cost of Living Rebate.

Eligible vulnerable households who receive the \$372 Queensland Electricity Rebate will automatically receive a \$700 Cost of Living Rebate on their electricity bill in 2023-24, bringing their total relief to \$1,072. All other Queensland households will automatically receive a \$550 Cost of Living Rebate on their electricity bill in 2023-24.

Specific questions relating to the eligibility and process for applying for the Electricity Rebate Scheme should be directed to the Honourable Mick de Brenni MP, Minister for Energy and Clean Economy Jobs, noting the Electricity Rebate Scheme falls within the portfolio responsibilities of the Minister.
