MR J BLEIJIE asked the Deputy Premier, Minister for State Development, Infrastructure, Local Government and Planning and Minister Assisting the Premier on Olympic and Paralympic Games Infrastructure (HON S MILES) –

QUESTION:

With reference to Table 22: Measures that matter on page 167 to 171 of the 2017 ShapingSEQ plan—

Will the Deputy Premier advise (a) if the South East Queensland Regional Plan 2023 Update will be using the same metrics to determine the success of the updated plan and (b) if so, why these metrics have not been included in the draft document released for public comment?

ANSWER [MINISTER FOR HOUSING, LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND PLANNING AND MINISTER FOR PUBLIC WORKS (HON M SCANLON)]:

On 18 December 2023, I was appointed as Minister for Housing, Local Government and Planning and Minister for Public Works and as such, I am now the responsible Minister to answer this Question.

- (a) The former ‘Measures that Matter’ metrics in the South East Queensland Regional Plan (*ShapingSEQ*) 2017 have been replaced by new indicators in *ShapingSEQ* 2023. For ‘Grow and Prosper’ these indicators include the former ‘Measures that Matter’ metrics in the *ShapingSEQ* 2017.
- (b) Performance monitoring for *ShapingSEQ* 2023 has been expanded beyond the former ‘Measures that Matter’ and now includes a suite of process, policy and contextual indicators that will continue to evolve and be expanded on to comprehensively monitor key outcomes sought by *ShapingSEQ* 2023.

These indicators more accurately reflect the policy within *ShapingSEQ* 2023 and enable the identification, collection, and analyses of the right kinds of indicators to communicate timely insights for decision-making and implementation assurance.

To facilitate this outcome, indicators are contained in the *ShapingSEQ Indicator Dictionary*, which is located outside of the *ShapingSEQ* 2023 document, and updated annually to ensure indicators remain relevant and fit for purpose.
