203 **MR J LANGBROEK** ASKED THE MINISTER FOR SENIORS AND DISABILITY SERVICES AND MINISTER FOR ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER PARTNERSHIPS (HON C CRAWFORD)

With reference to the new Queensland Disability Plan 2022-2027—

Will the Minister advise (a) what actions has the Queensland Government committed to delivering under Australia's Disability Strategy in the first three years, (b) how will success of the implementation of these actions be measured and (c) how often will the Disability Reform Implementation Interdepartmental Committee (DRIIC) meet to evaluate the progress and implementation of these actions?

Answer:

- (a) The Queensland Government has committed to actions under *Australia's Disability Strategy* through a series of national three-year action plans, called Targeted Action Plans (TAPs).

The actions include the delivery of the next state disability plan.

The first group of TAPs designed by jurisdictions under the strategy is due to finish and be evaluated in 2024. This will provide the opportunity for all jurisdictions to consider the success of the TAPs. New TAPs will be commissioned during the life of the strategy.

- (c) Disability Reform Implementation Interdepartmental Committee meetings are held on a quarterly basis or at the discretion of the Chair where consideration of urgent or emergent issues is required. The committee has a standing agenda item for each quarterly meeting to discuss Queensland's implementation of *Australia's Disability Strategy* and progress of departmental disability service plans.
