

## **Question on Notice**

**No. 207**

**Asked on 16 March 2023**

**MS F SIMPSON ASKED TREASURER AND MINISTER FOR TRADE AND INVESTMENT (HON C DICK)—**

### **QUESTION:**

Will the Treasurer advise (reported separately for financial years 2021-22 and 2022-23 to date) (a) the total number of Camera Detected Offence Program fines issued by Treasury, (b) the number of these that were referred to SPER due to non-payment and (c) the value of Camera Detected Offence Program fines that were referred to SPER?

### **ANSWER:**

I am advised that the authority to issue infringement notices for camera detected red light, speeding, Compulsory Third Party (CTP) insurance and registration offences transitioned to the Queensland Revenue Office (QRO), within Queensland Treasury, on 1 February 2022. On 30 November 2022, responsibility for issuing infringement notices for mobile phone and seatbelt offences also transitioned to QRO.

I am further advised that from February 2022 to June 2022 there were 398,980 infringement notices issued, which includes the number of infringement notices issued for camera detected red light, speeding, CTP insurance and registration offences which remain issued as at February 2023.

I am further advised that from 1 July 2022 to February 2023 there were 548,456 infringement notices issued, which includes the number of infringement notices for camera detected red light, speeding, CTP insurance and registration offences issued from 1 July 2022 and for camera detected mobile phone and seatbelt offences issued since 30 November 2022, which remain issued as at February 2023.

In relation to the above, I am advised that 133,804 and 191,113 respectively were referred to SPER due to non-payment (including Voluntary Instalment Plan referrals where they have defaulted).

I am further advised that the respective value of infringement notices referred to above is \$45.5 million and \$116.6 million.

Please note I am advised that this data is current as at March 2023 and is subject to change.
