MS S BOLTON ASKED MINISTER FOR ENERGY, RENEWABLES AND HYDROGEN AND MINISTER FOR PUBLIC WORKS AND PROCUREMENT (HON M DE BRENNI)

With reference to the Queensland-made homes initiative announced on 27 March 2023—

Will the Minister outline exactly how many homes will be built by the program, for the following cohorts, in the 2023-2024 financial year (a) essential workers, (b) people seeking emergency/crisis accommodation, (c) people on the social housing register and (d) any other cohorts?

ANSWER

As at 17 May 2023:

(a)

For essential workers, 120 of the 439 homes to be delivered under the government's 4-year program are planned under the Modern Methods of Construction program for delivery in 2023-24.

(b) and (c)

To provide government owned and managed accommodation for those on the Social Housing Register (including people seeking emergency/crisis accommodation), 52 new residences have been approved to be delivered under the Modern Methods of Construction program in 2023-24. These homes are in addition to Queensland's historic \$4B investment in social and affordable housing, which will deliver 13,000 homes for vulnerable Queenslanders by 2027.

(d)

There are no approved residences under any other cohorts being delivered under the Modern Methods of Construction in 2023-24.
