**MR M HART** ASKED MINISTER FOR HEALTH, MENTAL HEALTH AND AMBULANCE SERVICES AND MINISTER FOR WOMEN (HON S FENTIMAN)—

### QUESTION

With reference to answer to Question on Notice No. 101 of 2023 and patients waiting for an initial service event in a Specialist Outpatient Clinic—

Will the Minister advise (reported separately by the 29 specialties listed on the Queensland Reporting Hospitals website and by Hospital and Health Service) as at 1 April 2023 (a) the total number of patients waiting for an initial service event in a Specialist Outpatient Clinic and (b) the number of patients who have not been seen within the clinically recommended time waiting for an initial service event in a Specialist Outpatient Clinic?

### **ANSWER**

Planned Care services across Queensland have been significantly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic over the past three years. This has resulted from service restrictions related to public health measures and workforce impacts during the health system response to COVID-19.

As noted in the response to Question on Notice 101 of 2023, there has been a 55.8 per cent increase in specialist outpatient demand since 2016.

As we continue to learn to live with the pandemic, the number of Initial Service Events for specialist outpatients has increased. I am advised that for the financial year to date to March, there have been an additional 33,741 Initial Service Events compared to the same period last year.

When interrogating the data provided below, it is important to understand the unprecedented impact that COVID-19 had on Queensland's health system. It is almost without historical precedent.

The Queensland Audit Office noted the Palaszczuk Government's success in significantly reducing these wait lists through our Specialist Outpatient Strategy.

I am advised the tables below outline the Specialist Outpatient patients waiting, and patients who have not been seen within the clinically recommended timeframe, for an initial service event (long waits) as at 1 April 2023.
