MR J LISTER ASKED MINISTER FOR HEALTH, MENTAL HEALTH AND AMBULANCE SERVICES AND MINISTER FOR WOMEN (HON S FENTIMAN)—

QUESTION

With reference to answer to Question on Notice No. 516 of 2022— Will the Minister provide the percentage of Patient off Stretcher Times (POST) achieved within 30 minutes (reported separately by calendar month from January 2012 to June 2021) for the Toowoomba Hospital?

ANSWER

It is widely acknowledged that ambulance ramping is not solely an emergency department capacity issue, rather it is reflective of whole-of-hospital pressures that contribute to emergency department overcrowding and delays in offloading patients.

As demands on Queensland's hospitals continue to grow, so do the number of presentations to our Emergency Departments.

The Putting Patients First plan delivers \$764 million of investment to specifically address ambulance access at hospitals and relieve the health system pressures that contribute to emergency department wait times.

The Putting Patient's First plan is focused on:

- Keeping Queenslanders out of hospital and providing alternatives to emergency departments
- Supercharging virtual care
- Strengthening our Queensland Ambulance Service
- Investing in more frontline health workers
- More beds for our growing population.

I am advised that the percentage of Patient Off Stretcher Times achieved within 30 minutes reported separately by calendar month from January 2012 to June 2021 for the Toowoomba Hospital is provided in the following tables.
