# **QUESTION:**

Will the Minister provide the total number of go cards that have been used in the last 12 months (reported separately by type (adult, senior etc))?

### ANSWER:

I thank the Member for Chatsworth for the question.

The Department of Transport and Main Roads is committed to providing a single, integrated transport system accessible to everyone. Queenslanders use public transport to connect to jobs, education, health and other essential services.

go cards allow customers to travel on all Translink bus, train, ferry and tram services across greater Brisbane, Ipswich, Sunshine Coast and Gold Coast regions.

The total number of *go* cards used between 1 June 2022 to 31 May 2023, reported separately by *go* card type, was as follows:

- adult 1,729,647
- child 245,269
- seniors 293,356
- concession 405,754.

For the 12 months ending 31 May 2023, over 2.67 million *go* cards were used across the network in South East Queensland (SEQ). This compares encouragingly with pre-COVID-19 figures which were around 2.76 million *go* cards being used in the 2018–19 financial year.

The Palaszczuk Government is investing \$371 million in a new Smart Ticketing system that enables customers to pay for public transport using a Visa, Mastercard or American Express contactless debit or credit card, smartphone, smart watch or smart device. Smart Ticketing is currently available for travel on adult go card fares between all G:link, Queensland Rail (SEQ) and Airtrain stations.
