MR R MOLHOEK ASKED THE MINISTER HOUSING (HON M SCANLON)-

QUESTION:

Will the Minister provide the details of actual expenditure for each financial year from 2013 to 2023 in respect of construction of new housing, land acquisition, housing purchases and capital grants (reported separately by category and region) in the same format as the Queensland Budget Capital Expenditure Statement?

ANSWER:

Between 2012-13 and 2022-23, the department has spent \$3.848 billion through capital works or capital grants to construct, purchase or upgrade social housing.

In the 2012-13 financial year, \$122.032 million was expended on construction, \$26.524 million was expended on acquisitions, \$6.990 million was expended on land, \$95.218 million was expended on upgrades and \$116.195 million was expended on capital grants.

In the 2013-14 financial year, \$94.280 million was expended on construction, \$8.273 million was expended on acquisitions, \$0.359 million was expended on land, \$85.657 million was expended on upgrades and \$54.338 million was expended on capital grants.

In the 2014-15 financial year, \$93.963 million was expended on construction, \$21.910 million was expended on acquisitions, \$7.139 million was expended on land, \$103.629 million was expended on upgrades and \$60.789 million was expended on capital grants.

In the 2015-16 financial year, \$125.787 million was expended on construction, \$32.435 million was expended on acquisitions, \$23.373 million was expended on land, \$113.513 million was expended on upgrades and \$48.136 million was expended on capital grants.

In the 2016-17 financial year, \$153.789 million was expended on construction, \$29.062 million was expended on acquisitions, \$17.266 million was expended on land, \$99.640 million was expended on upgrades and \$53.608 million was expended on capital grants.

In the 2017-18 financial year, \$199.956 million was expended on construction, \$7.294 million was expended on acquisitions, \$29.278 million was expended on land, \$102.867 million was expended on upgrades and \$47.092 million was expended on capital grants.

In the 2018-19 financial year, \$152.178 million was expended on construction, \$1.553 million was expended on acquisitions, \$32.600 million was expended on land,

\$107.018 million was expended on upgrades and \$46.875 million was expended on capital grants.

In the 2019-20 financial year, \$177.241 million was expended on construction, \$2.327 million was expended on acquisitions, \$44.148 million was expended on land, \$96.439 million was expended on upgrades and \$56.891 million was expended on capital grants.

In the 2020-21 financial year, \$150.607 million was expended on construction, \$3.759 million was expended on acquisitions, \$20.194 million was expended on land, \$93.572 million was expended on upgrades and \$51.757 million was expended on capital grants.

In the 2021-22 financial year, \$113.252 million was expended on construction, \$25.452 million was expended on acquisitions, \$38.502 million was expended on land, \$65.975 million was expended on upgrades and \$69.104 million was expended on capital grants.

In the 2022-23 financial year, \$118.015 million was expended on construction, \$87.762 million was expended on acquisitions, \$24.897 million was expended on land, \$98.080 million was expended on upgrades and \$189.656 million was expended on capital grants.

Information above does not include plant and equipment, or other capital expenditure related to non-social housing activity.

The department is unable to provide a regional breakdown of expenditure for all years between 2012-13 and 2022-23.

*It is noted that the department's expenditure figures in the *Queensland Budget Capital Expenditure Statement 2023-24* and as referred to in the question to the Minster breakdown the budgeted expenditure by statistical areas.

The department does not currently have records from which actual expenditure figures can be readily broken down to such a location level for every year for the period in the question.
