MR M CRANDON ASKED MINISTER FOR HEALTH, MENTAL HEALTH AND AMBULANCE SERVICES AND MINISTER FOR WOMEN (HON S FENTIMAN)—

QUESTION

With reference to the Patient Travel Subsidy Scheme—

Will the Minister provide (reported separately by financial year and Hospital and Health Service) from 2015-16 to 2022-23 (a) the total number of accommodated nights subsidised by the 'Accommodation Subsidy', (b) the total dollar value spent on (i) the 'Accommodation Subsidy', (ii) the private motor vehicle component of the 'Travel Subsidy' and (iii) the commercial component of the 'Travel Subsidy'?

ANSWER

As part of the 2023-24 State Budget, the Queensland Government has provided an additional \$70.3 million funding over four years to increase existing Patient Travel Subsidy Scheme (PTSS) concession rates.

On 1 July 2023, accommodation rates for eligible PTSS patients increased from \$60 per person per night, to \$70 per person per night, and mileage concession rates increased from 30 cents to 34 cents per kilometre.

Also on 1 July 2023, the Queensland Government provided funding for the full cost of repatriation of deceased eligible PTSS patients on PTSS-related travel to their Queensland place of residence or their Queensland Traditional Homelands or their Queensland First Nations Country.

The increase of concession rates, and the introduction of funding to support the repatriation of deceased patients, to their Queensland place of residence or their Queensland Traditional Homelands or their Queensland First Nations Country, has resulted in considerable growth to the PTSS budget, with \$113.8 million allocated to PTSS for 2023-24.

I note this question relates to accommodation expenditure and travel expenditure by Hospital and Health Service (HHS) for the 2015-16 to 2022-23 period. I am advised that detailed expenditure data is only available from 2019-20, when the HHSs transitioned to new Information Communication Technology travel management systems (being 'PTIMS' and 'OPTML'). I refer the Member to Table 1 below. To source details prior to 2019-20 would require going to each HHS which I am advised would be an unreasonable diversion of Queensland Health resources.

However, I am advised that the total PTSS expenditure to support Queensland patients to travel for their treatment from 2015-16 to 2022-23 is \$636.6 million.

The Accommodation Subsidy data includes expenditure for patient and escort accommodation, private and commercial. The Private Motor Vehicle Subsidy data includes expenditure for mileage for patients and escorts.

The Commercial Travel Subsidy data includes expenditure for patient and escort air fares, bus fares and rail fares.

Consequently, I am advised that to source this information for the Member would be an unreasonable diversion of Queensland Health resources.
