1041 MR D JANETZKI ASKED ATTORNEY-GENERAL AND MINISTER FOR JUSTICE AND MINISTER FOR THE PREVENTION OF DOMESTIC AND FAMILY VIOLENCE (HON Y D'ATH)

With reference to the then Premier's announcement in December 2022 of increased maximum penalties for juvenile car thieves—

Will the Attorney-General advise (reported separately by year and region) (a) the number of juvenile offenders convicted of unlawful use of a motor vehicle (i) who have been sentenced to the maximum penalty of 10 years' imprisonment, (ii) with aggravating circumstances (at night/threatens violence/uses violence/armed/in company/damages property) who have been sentenced to the maximum penalty of 14 years' imprisonment, (b) the number of juvenile offenders sentenced to the previous maximum penalty of seven years' imprisonment from 2015 to 2022 and (c) the longest prison sentence served by juvenile car thieves from (i) 2015 to December 2022 and (ii) January 2023 to present?
