QUESTION:

Will the Minister advise the (a) rate and (b) total number of victims, of unlawful entry with intent offences between 1 January 2024 and the day of the change of government, (reported separately by rate, number, offence and Police District, in a table)?

ANSWER:

I am advised by the Queensland Police Service that it does not attribute a personal victim to unlawful entry offences, only a location. Moreover, the QPS does not differentiate (statistically) if the address is private or commercial, or if there are multiple inhabitants as the address is only counted as one victim.

To that end, the number and rate of reported victims for unlawful entry with intent, using the location as a victim from 1 January 2024 to 25 October 2024 is detailed in the table below:
