## Question on Notice No. 1124 Asked on 28 November 2024

Ms J Pugh asked Premier and Minister for Veterans (Hon. D Crisafulli)—

QUESTION:

With reference to the Premier's comments on 3 October 2024 stating 'we'll be setting targets for fewer victims year on year'—

Will the Premier advise the victim number targets from 2025 to 2028 (reported separately by year)?

ANSWER:

Our Government is committed to ensuring there are fewer victims of crime in Queensland. To deliver on this commitment, I have tasked relevant Ministers and government agencies to establish clear and accurate targets. Once established, those targets will be made public.

As the Member will be aware, as a Government, we have taken the first steps to reduce the number of victims of crime by introducing and passing the Making Queensland Safer Laws before Christmas 2024 – just as we said we would.

The Laws will act as a deterrent to serious, recidivist youth offenders. These laws include *Adult Crime, Adult Time* and, importantly, will remove *Detention as a Last Resort*. The Making Queensland Safer laws will also empower the courts to consider an offender's full criminal history when sentencing.

In answering the Member's question, I would also like to the take the opportunity to share how it is the objective of the Government to deal with victims of crime with decency and respect at all times.
