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**MS J PUGH** ASKED MINISTER FOR YOUTH JUSTICE AND MINISTER FOR CORRECTIVE SERVICES (HON L GERBER)

### **QUESTION:**

With reference to page 3 of the Minister's Charter Letter, where it outlines the Minister must 'Work with Ministerial colleagues and the non-government sector to establish and deliver Staying on Track, the 12-month rehabilitation program for young people leaving detention', and the LNP Government's 100 Day Plan to 'BEGIN work to tender for the Staying on Track Program to divert at-risk children from turning to crime and rehabilitate youth offenders' –

Will the Minister provide any departmental or official advice the Minister has received on the government's proposed Staying on Track program?

### **ANSWER:**

The Crisafulli Government is committed to restoring safety in Queensland homes, workplaces and communities.

The Making Queensland Safer Plan is well underway. On 13 December 2024, the Making Queensland Safer Laws became law.

The Staying on Track program is in the design and planning phase. Advice provided by the Department to date forms part of Cabinet considerations.
