MRS M NIGHTINGALE ASKED MINISTER FOR YOUTH JUSTICE AND VICTIM SUPPORT AND MINISTER FOR CORRECTIVE SERVICES (HON L GERBER)

QUESTION:

Will the Minister outline the specific and measurable criteria that will define LNP Government's promise of gold standard early intervention programs?

ANSWER:

The Crisafulli Government is committed to restoring safety in Queensland homes, workplaces and communities.

The Making Queensland Safer Plan is well underway. On 13 December 2024, the Making Queensland Safer Laws became law.

I acknowledge that the Member for Inala voted to support the Crisafulli Government's strong new laws.

The Making Queensland Safer Laws will be bolstered by an additional \$485 million investment in early intervention, crime prevention and rehabilitation programs, including \$100 million for Gold Standard Early Intervention to support community-led initiatives focused on reducing crime, boosting education, training and/or employment. Gold Standard Early Intervention includes \$50 million for a kick-starter program to fund new ideas, and \$50 million to expand proven initiatives.

The tender process for Gold Standard Early Intervention is set to occur as soon as possible, and performance indicators will be identified as part of this process.
