MR M CRANDON ASKED MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND MAIN ROADS AND MINISTER FOR DIGITAL SERVICES (HON B MELLISH)—

QUESTION:

Will the Minister advise for each red light camera location in Queensland, the number of offences detected in 2023 (reported separately by red light or speed offence)?

ANSWER:

I thank the Member for Coomera for the question.

In 2023, there was a total of 108 operational fixed red light cameras, and combined red light and speed cameras. These operations resulted in:

- total detections: 157,553
- total red light offence detections: 115,412
- total speeding offence detections: 42,141.

The Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) and Queensland Police Service are responsible for speed and red light camera operations, while the Queensland Revenue Office issues camera detected infringements.

Operational hours of cameras will vary as sites may not be operational for a period of time due to roadworks, site reassessments, site validations and other operational requirements.

I am advised by TMR that disclosing camera operations at individual sites is potentially detrimental in supporting road safety outcomes, as location data reveals information about the operations of specific sites.
