

## **Question on Notice**

**DR M ROBINSON** ASKED MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND MAIN ROADS AND MINISTER FOR DIGITAL SERVICES (HON B MELLISH)—

### **QUESTION:**

Will the Minister advise how many park 'n' ride spaces have been delivered across Redland City since 2020 (with the figures broken down and reported separately by year for each bus and train facility)?

### **ANSWER:**

I thank the Member for Oodgeroo for the question.

The Miles Government is delivering its eighth record transport and roads infrastructure program in a row, as detailed in the *Queensland Transport and Roads Investment Program 2023–24 to 2026–27*, which outlines \$32.1 billion in investment over the next four years and is estimated to support an average of 25,200 direct jobs over the life of the program.

In 2016, 46 new car spaces were delivered at Thorneside train station park 'n' ride, increasing the number of available spaces to 180. A Birkdale train station park 'n' ride expansion is currently in planning and will deliver almost 40 additional car spaces.

In addition, the Miles Government has also delivered infrastructure for the Redland City region including the Redland Bay Marina bus station (opened 2017), the new Victoria Point Central bus station (opened 2019), and a complete transformation of the Southern Moreton Bay Islands ferry terminals (opened 2023).

To address capacity issues, the Miles Government also announced a \$15 million contribution to deliver a multi-level carpark at the Weinam Creek ferry terminal. Working collaboratively with the Redlands City Council, the project will support commuters and visitors to the Southern Moreton Bay Island region.
