MR N DAMETTO ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND COMMUNITY SAFETY (HON M RYAN)—

QUESTION:

With reference to the 2021-25 Sexual Violence Response Strategy and the Queensland Police Service announcement that it would commence trauma informed practice training for QPS staff to improve responses to victims of sexual violence across the state—

Will the Minister advise how many QPS staff have received trauma informed practice training to date?

ANSWER:

I am advised by the Queensland Police Service (QPS) the following courses fall within the scope of specific victim centric trauma informed training:

- Domestic and Family Violence: The Holistic Approach
- Domestic and Family Violence: The Holistic Approach Extension
- Domestic and Family Violence Vulnerable Persons Specialist
- Domestic and Family Violence Vulnerable Persons Specialist (Leadership)
- Communications and Policelink Domestic and Family Violence Vulnerable Persons Specialist
- Domestic and Family Violence: Investigations for First Year Constables
- Recruit Cultural Capability Training First Nations Peoples
- Recruit Training Domestic Violence: Lived Experience

I am advised by the QPS that for the above list of training courses there have been 23,174 instances of completed training by QPS Staff, including 13,993 individual staff members who have completed the *Domestic and Family Violence: The Holisitc Approach* training, since June 2022.
