MR S MINNIKIN ASKED MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND MAIN ROADS AND MINISTER FOR DIGITAL SERVICES (HON B MELLISH)—

QUESTION:

Will the Minister provide for the 2021, 2022 and 2023 calendar years, the number of people who died on Queensland's roads (reported separately by age and year)?

ANSWER:

I thank the Member for Chatsworth for the question.

Every life lost has a tragic impact on individuals, families and communities across our State. During the 2021 calendar year, 275 people lost their lives as a result of crashes on Queensland roads, 297 lives were lost during the 2022 calendar year and 278 lives were lost during the 2023 calendar year.

The number of lives lost as a result of crashes by age group in Queensland from 2021 to 2023 is as follows:

- Age group 0 to 4:
 - 2021 – six
 - 2022 – two
 - 2023 – two
- Age group 5 to 11:
 - 2021 – three
 - 2022 – five
 - 2023 – zero
- Age group 12 to 16:
 - 2021 – six
 - 2022 – 10
 - 2023 – five
- Age group 17 to 20:
 - 2021 – 29
 - 2022 – 19
 - 2023 – 33
- Age group 21 to 24:
 - 2021 – 19
 - 2022 – 32
 - 2023 – 23
- Age group 25 to 29:
 - 2021 – 33
 - 2022 – 33
 - 2023 – 25
- Age group 30 to 39:
 - 2021 – 51
 - 2022 – 51
 - 2023 – 47

- Age group 40 to 49:
 - 2021 – 33
 - 2022 – 33
 - 2023 – 41
- Age group 50 to 59:
 - 2021 – 36
 - 2022 – 34
 - 2023 – 32
- Age group 60 to 74:
 - 2021 – 31
 - 2022 – 45
 - 2023 – 46
- Age group 75 and over:
 - 2021 – 28
 - 2022 – 33
 - 2023 – 24
- Total lives lost for all groups:
 - 2021 – 275
 - 2022 – 297
 - 2023 – 278.
