**MR M BERKMAN** ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND COMMUNITY SAFETY (HON M RYAN)—

QUESTION:

With reference to the deployment of the Counter-Terrorism Investigation Group (CTIG) in response to political protests— Will the Minister advise (a) in the 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2023-24 (to date) financial years respectively, how many times have the CTIG been used in response to political protests and (b) how many officers who are part of the CTIG were deployed for the raids and execution of search warrants on five individuals following a January 8 demonstration, (i) by whom and on what basis was the decision made to involve CTIG officers; and (ii) what was the cost of this?

ANSWER:

I am advised by the Queensland Police Service (QPS) that the Counter-Terrorism Investigation Group (CTIG) supports police responses in a variety of circumstances in the interests of community safety. In the interests of protecting Queensland's security and intelligence environment, I am unable to provide any additional information about police methodologies.
