MR S KNUTH ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND COMMUNITY SAFETY (HON M RYAN)—

QUESTION:

With reference to an elderly member who recently noticed a break-in at the Tully Gem Club and immediately contacted police to report the theft but was advised to fill out a police incident form online and as this system is cumbersome for the elderly who do not have access to or have difficulties in using online services—

Will the Minister (a) confirm if this is normal practice and (b) if so, change the system to ensure reporting of break-ins can also be completed at local police stations in addition to online through Policelink?

ANSWER:

I am advised by the Queensland Police Service (QPS) that there has been no change to reporting processes and where the matter is not urgent, options for reporting include calling Policelink on 131444, reporting online via the QPS website or attending a local station.

Any member of the public who is in immediate danger should call Triple Zero for urgent assistance.
