MR D ZANOW ASKED MINISTER FOR EDUCATION AND MINISTER FOR YOUTH JUSTICE (HON D FARMER)

QUESTION:

With reference to page 35 of the 2024–25 Budget Capital Statement, specifically, the Growth projects in various regions funded under the Department of Education—

Will the Minister provide a breakdown of this funding (reported separately by individual project and by financial year) from 2024–25 to 2027–28?

ANSWER:

Investment in educational infrastructure must respond to current needs and proactively plan for the future. To ensure infrastructure is delivered in the right place at the right time, the budget allocated for Growth in the various regions comprises of two types of projects—the construction of new general and specialist learning spaces, and pre-construction planning and design activities linked to future need for general and specialist learning spaces.

A breakdown of state schools allocated funding for Growth projects in the 2024–25 State Budget is provided below.

Budget allocations for these projects remain confidential until post award of the contract to preserve the competitive tender process.

Unless otherwise stated, there is no budget allocated for these projects in 2026–27 and 2027–28.
