HON M SCANLON ASKED THE MINISTER FOR HOUSING AND PUBLIC WORKS AND MINISTER FOR YOUTH (HON S O'CONNOR)—

QUESTION:

Will the Minister advise, from 1 July 2024 to the latest month for which data has been collected (reported separately for each region (e.g. South West Region etc.) and by month), (a) the number of 'outcomes' by the department's Critical Response Team (or rebranded HOME Team) not funded by a Specialist Homelessness Service and (b) the 'type' of housing 'outcome' in each instance?

ANSWER:

From 1 July 2024 to 30 September 2025, 1,741 housing outcomes were facilitated by the Housing Outreach and Mobile Engagement (HOME) team.

(a) The below table identifies the number of outcomes delivered between 1 July 2024 to 30 September 2025 broken down by region.

(b) The department's HOME team works alongside state-funded Specialist Homelessness Services who are often best placed to provide the most appropriate response for people experiencing homelessness due to the case management support available to help people sustain a housing pathway. The HOME supports referral pathways to Specialist Homelessness Services, other government agencies, and the department's Housing Service Centres if the individual's most appropriate response is through social or community housing, or a product offered by the department to help maintain a tenancy in the private market.

There are several different accommodation types available depending on an individual's needs. This includes access to social and community housing, headleased homes, motel/hotel accommodation, crisis accommodation, supported accommodation, return to family, boarding accommodation and private market housing.
