**MR M BERKMAN** ASKED MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND MAIN ROADS (HON B MICKELBERG)—

**QUESTION:**

With reference to policing and enforcement of public transport fares—

Will the Minister provide the following information for each month from July 2024 to November 2025 (a) the number of full-time equivalent staff whose role description includes enforcement and the total cost of their wages, (b) the number of warnings given in relation to fare evasion, (c) the number of on the spot fines given in relation to fare evasion and (d) the number of charges for fare evasion prosecuted in the Magistrates Court?

**ANSWER:**

I thank the Member for the question.

The Crisafulli Government is committed to providing safe public transport for everyone and employs a frontline enforcement workforce to assist with deterring fare evasion and anti-social behaviour on the network, while working closely with service providers and agencies such as Queensland Police Service.

These frontline staff operate across all modes of public transport, playing a key role in targeting fare evasion at hot spots, providing customer service, and keeping our transport network safe.

Providing an accurate answer to the Member's question, and sub questions, is significantly resource intensive and involves an unreasonable diversion of staff, across a number of agencies, from carrying out their core responsibilities.
