HON G GRACE asked the Deputy Premier, Minister for State Development, Infrastructure and Planning and Minister for Industrial Relations (HON J BLEIJIE) –

QUESTION:

With reference to a statewide audit of surplus government land undertaken by the former Labor Government following the 2022 Queensland Housing Summit which identified 27 larger sites for detailed investigation by Economic Development Queensland (EDQ) and a further 419 smaller sites with potential for housing—

Will the Deputy Premier advise (a) for the 27 larger sites, how many have been fully investigated, how many are currently under investigation, and how many have not yet commenced investigation, (b) for the 419 smaller sites, how many have been assessed as suitable for housing, how many are still being assessed and how many have been ruled out and (c) what infrastructure funding or other government funding has been allocated in the 25–26 Queensland Budget to enable development on any of these sites, including the amount and the sites to which it applies?

ANSWER:

- (a) Of the list of 27 sites, Economic Development Queensland (EDQ) was allocated 18 to investigate, and all have been fully investigated.
- (b) This element of the question should be referred to the Minister for Housing and Public Works as per the allocation decision made by the former Government.
- (c) Funding was allocated in the 2025-26 Budget to EDQ to unlock sites that can deliver new housing for Queenslanders at pace and scale. This includes \$44.38 million for two of the land audit sites referred to in the question. Federal funding has also been secured.
