**HON M DE BRENNI** ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES (HON D PURDIE)—

## QUESTION:

With reference to volume of work and allegation of under allocation of resources to respond to such workload—

Will the Minister advise for the 2024 calendar year (a) the total number of calls for service across Queensland, (b) the number of calls for service in the suburbs of Rochedale South, Springwood, Daisy Hill, Shailer Park, Mount Cotton, Sheldon, Priestdale and (c) the number of police allocated to respond to those calls in the above listed suburbs?

## **ANSWER:**

I am advised by the Queensland Police Service that for the 2024 calendar year:

There were 1,523,381 calls for service across Queensland. Of these, there were 2,103 calls in Rochedale South, 2,712 in Springwood, 1,502 in Daisy Hill, 1,923 in Shailer Park, 723 in Mount Cotton, 359 in Sheldon and 69 in Priestdale.

The requested locations are serviced by police divisions in Capalaba, Cleveland, Logan Central, Loganholme, Redland Bay, and Springwood. The approved permanent positions and substantive headcount for each division, as at 31 December 2024, are provided in the table below:

I am further advised that police stations have the ability when required to draw on resources from other geographically close police stations or districts should it be required to effectively provide policing services to the community. Police districts have the discretion and flexibility to move resources around as demand dictates to keep Queenslanders safe.
